Yes. . Mentors ensure the intellectual, emotional and physical well being of their wards. Students attendance and performance are monitored. They also maintain personal contact with parents who are occasionally called for a meeting with the mentors. Academic requirements like submission of assignments, continuous internal assessment and model examinations are also monitored by the mentors. The students are need-based remedial classes, for those students found lagging behind in specified areas. The mentors also motivate the wards to participate in the co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the college. The general conduct of students is also supervised by the mentor. The mentors meet the students during personal contact session. Thus the mentors are able to identify problems and suggest suitable measures to overcome hurdles in the academic sphere. Students with serious personal issues are advised to go for counselling. The parents are also kept in the loop.

The College plans to co-opt successful alumnae who can give exposure to students in career opportunities to brighten their job prospects. Linkages with industry are to be promoted for training and jobs, so that the graduates of the College are skilled and employable. The research environment of the college is expanded by constituting a Research Cell. Faculty are to be motivated to publish research articles in high-impact journals both national and international.
